

# What is Identity?

- Has been studied from various points of view
  - ► IT: security (authentication and such)
  - Sociology: one's placement in a society
  - Psychology: personal feeling of self (?)

# **Understanding Identity**



#### Identity and Uniqueness

- In general, identity is
  - ► Far from unique
    - Identity politics is about heritage or social groupings
    - ▶ You identify yourself as a researcher
  - May not be discrete or "crisply" defined
  - May not be credentialed
- Identity in IT: discrete and credentialed
  - Objects with guaranteed unique identifiers
  - Personae in online social networks
- Typical IT representation:
  - A set of attribute-value pairs
  - Often including some attributes that guarantee uniqueness
    - Identifier

### **Identity and Norms**

- We need identity as a basis for trust
  - ▶ Reflected in all decision-making, including about commitments, authorizations, powers, . . .
- ▶ If we can establish an identity without authenticating to an individual, we gain
  - Effective audit and control
  - While supporting improved privacy


# An Organizational Approach

Read Org as group, community, or social circle

- Nested or partially overlapping Orgs, defined via roles
  - A principal is an individual or an Org
  - A principal adopts one or more roles in one or more Orgs
- ▶ On adopting a role, a principal acquires a token (signed by the Org)
  - One or more of the tokens signifies its identity for interactions as that role within the Org
  - ► And jointly with the Org's tokens for outside interactions
- An identity service verifies tokens
  - More generally, all such attributes in a message header


